Wherever you are on this train, I encourage you think it over and contribute where you can. Along the




way, be sure to look around, enjoy those around you and take in this wonderful experience.





### FROM THE MEMBERSHIP CHAIRMAN

### Division 8 Membership. What does it mean?

Division 8 of the Mid Central Region is your local organization of the National Model Railroad Association. But you knew that already. The requirements to be a member of Division 8 are as follows:

- 1. Live within the geographical limits of Division 8.
- 2. Pay your NMRA dues.

That is it.

Last August members of our division voted on new By-Laws that put Division 8 in compliance with the definition of a division by NMRA's own By-Laws. This changed the definition of a member to the above. Any member fitting the definition is allowed to participate in division activities and vote for division officers. Along with this change the definition of "Associate Member," or a member who paid an "activity fee" to Division 8 but was not an NMRA member, was eliminated.

So what about the \$10 "activity fee" now? It is not required to be a participating member. The activity fee gets you a mailed subscription of the <u>Pie Card</u> and Division 8 may apply additional benefits to individuals who offer to pay it such as the discounted lunch at the upcoming division picnic. With a First Class stamp now at 44 cents, postage for the Pie Card alone is \$5.28 per year. As the number of "subscribers" to the <u>Pie Card</u> decrease the ability to cover its printing is diminished, occasionally resulting in support from Division 8 funds to make it so. Therefore the Division makes incentives for folks to pay this optional payment.

Being able to participate in division activities is one of the benefits of NMRA membership. Many of the events our division holds are made possible by our ability to obtain liability insurance through the NMRA. This insurance is predicated on participants being NMRA members (with some exceptions.) Some of these activities, such as the Swap Meet, generate funds for the division that make additional activities possible. The clinics and competitions at monthly division meetings are but one way to reward membership. The standing around and talking about trains is a benefit too. After all if it were not for Division 8 getting us together each month we might not have such a good opportunity to trade thoughts and ideas with our fellow model railroaders.

Visitors to Division 8 monthly meetings are encouraged. It is the best way for an individual to see if the NMRA is right for him. If you are already an NMRA member in the Louisville area and have not been to a Division 8 meeting please come! It is your organization. But as stated division meetings and activities are benefits of NMRA membership and, like the Elks, American Legion, or Rotary Club, you will have to join the organization to continue to participate.

The bottom line is that for Division 8 to exist the NMRA must exist. They have the deep pockets that make

almost all of this happen. With the worst recession since the Great Depression upon us the NMRA has never been in a more vulnerable position as it is now. So if you are an NMRA member reading this I thank you for your continued membership and support. You are greatly appreciated. If you are not a member yet I encourage you to join. Every member is necessary to make our organization continue to function and thrive for generations to come.
