FIRST PLACE (above)

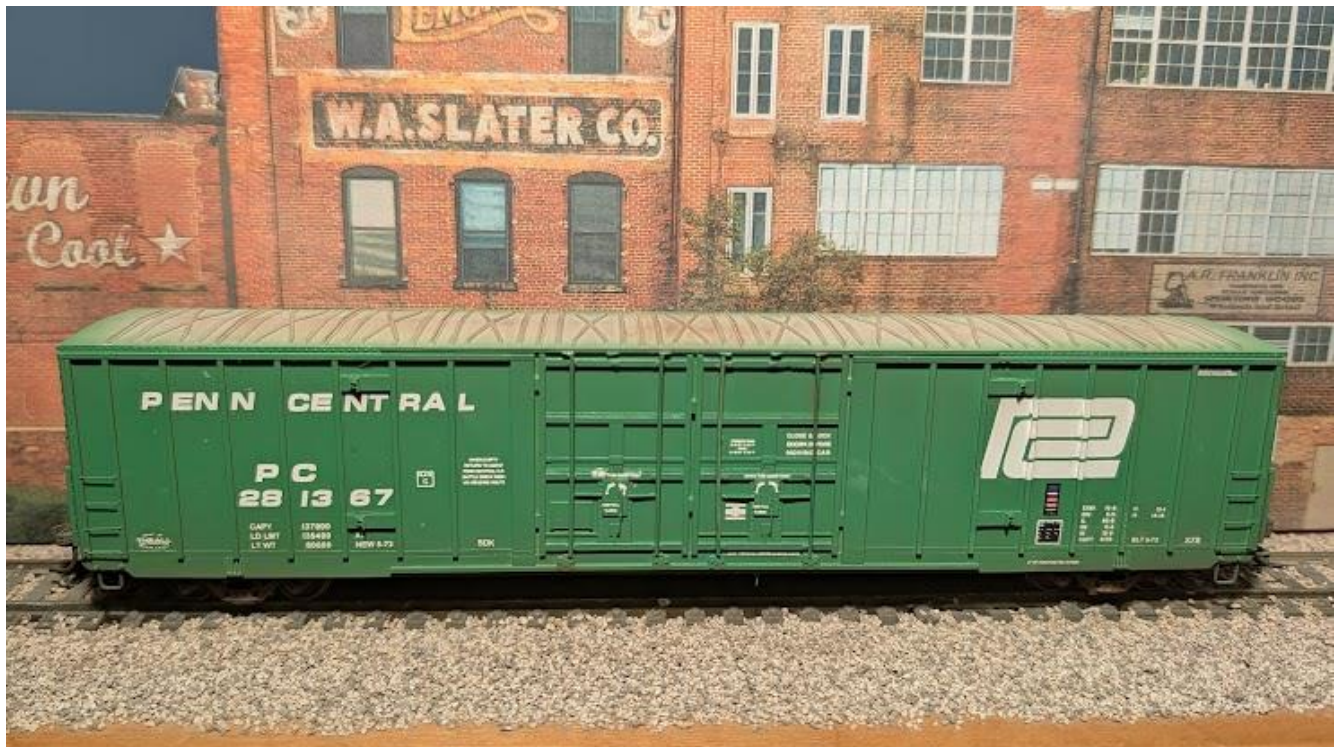
Bob Frankrone's HO "Garbage Can Gondola."

Bob built this model from an Athearn 50 ft. gondola kit. He weathered it inside and out using acrylic washes and weathering powders. He also weathered the "trash" before putting it in the gondola.

TIED FOR SECOND PLACE (below)

Craig Hatter's HO "Penn Central X79 High Cube Box Car 281567."

Craig assembled this Rail Yard Models resin kit. He painted it with Scalecoat II Penn Central Green and Scalecoat II gray for the roof. He used the decals provided with the kit. Minimal weathering was applied to represent the car being in service for less than a year.





TIED FOR SECOND PLACE (above)

Ed Brennan's MMR® HO "Ulrich Drop Bottom Gondola"

This is a white metal kit that Ed bought many years ago. He made several modifications to the basic model to enhance its appearance and operations. The kit couplers were replaced with Kadee's and the wheels were replaced with 33" metal wheels by Intermountain. He added air hoses and touched up the paint.

HONORABLE MENTION (below)

Randy Griggs' S-Scale UP "UPP 809 Jim Adams Auxiliary Water Tender. The model was 3D Printed. He made the red lettering decals (except for the stripes). He printed the flag on cardstock and attached it to the car.

2026 Division 8 Elections were held. See The Pie Card for details.

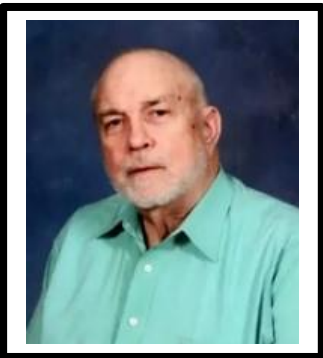

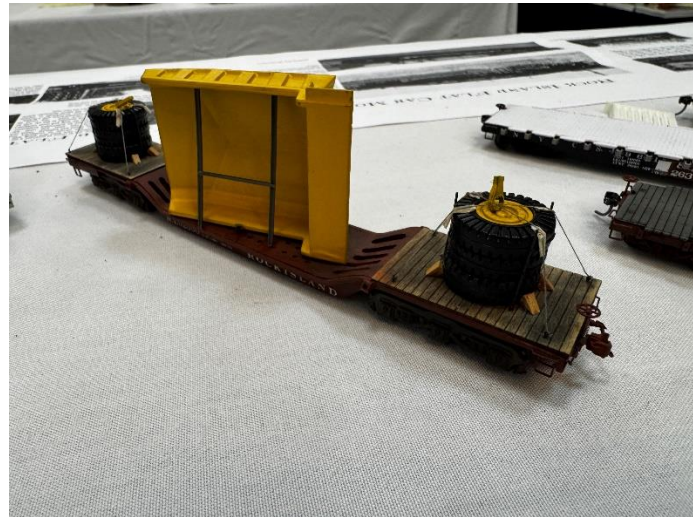
2026 PROTOTYPE RAILS COCOA BEACH FLORIDA RAILROAD PROTOTYPE MODELERS (RPM) MEET

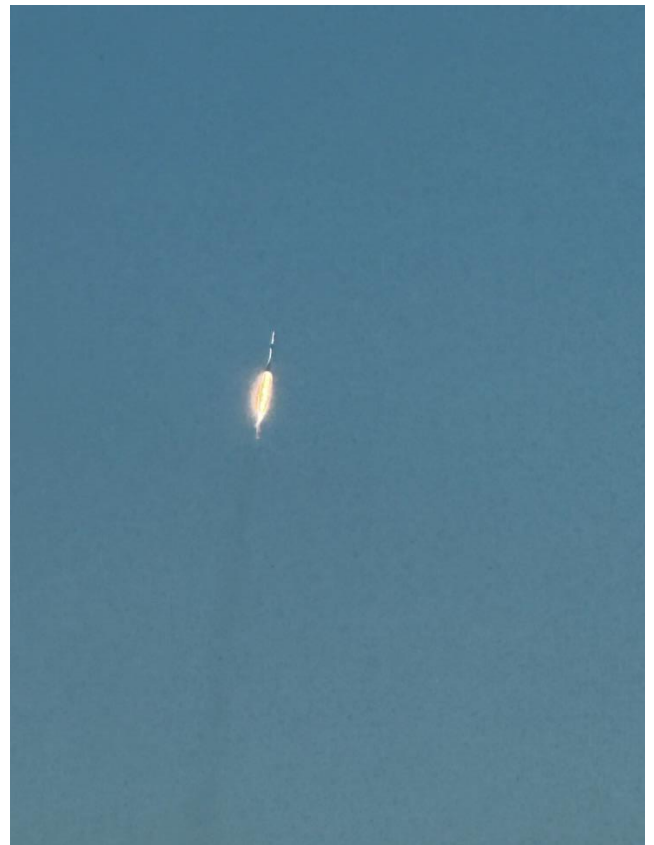

One of the unique features of operating this section of the layout is the off-loading inside the facility. When a pair of cars are dropped off, a timer begins counting down the time it takes a crew to unload the cars (15 minutes). When that's completed, the locomotive crews remove those two cars from the facility then drop off two more cars. While the time is counting down, the crew is supposed to be working on moving other cars around the facility.

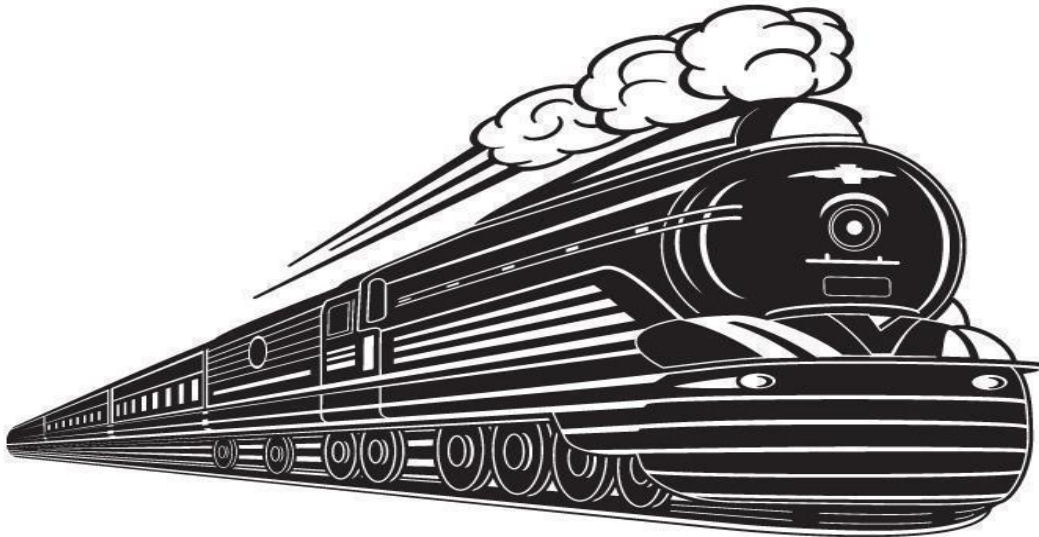
